## Now Available: Mental Health First Aid Course

*The mission of the Office of Developmental Programs is to support Pennsylvanians with developmental disabilities to achieve greater independence, choice and opportunity in their lives.*

**AUDIENCE:** Individuals and Families, Individuals providing supports to individuals with mental health disorders, intellectual disabilities, and/or Autism, Supports Coordination Organizations, Supports Coordination Supervisors, Supports Coordinators, Participant Directed Providers and Provider's Program Managers, and all interested parties.

**PURPOSE:** Mental Health First Aid Courses are now available

**DISCUSSION:**

The Office of Developmental Programs (ODP), along with the Office of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (OMHSAS), is pleased to announce the availability of Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) instruction. Mental Health First Aid is being offered as part of the Collaborative Capacity Building Initiative funded through Money Follows the Person (MFP). MFP is the largest single financial investment in home and community based long-term living services ever offered by the Federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). MFP is designed to allow individuals residing in certain institutional settings to transition to and receive services in a community-based setting.

Mental Health First Aid is an 8 hour educational program in use throughout the country to teach people how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance abuse disorders. The training gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide offer initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.

Just like training in regular first aid, Mental Health First Aid does not teach you to be the professional, the therapist, or the counselor. Mental Health First Aid takes the fear and

hesitation out of starting conversations about mental health and substance use problems by improving understanding and teaching people to safely and responsibly identify and address a potential mental illness or substance use disorder. When more people are equipped with the tools they need to start a dialogue, more people can get the help they need.

Through this ODP/OMHSAS initiative, Mental Health First Aid classes are being offered twice a month at varying locations throughout the state as coordinated by the Instructor, Jen Bankard. 1. Click on the **Training** drop-down menu

3. Select **Mental Health First Aid**
