HealthChoices Updates

Behavioral Health: Brad Williams, OMHSAS

- **BH-MCO Contracts for implementation date 7/1/18 being sent out today for MCO review. Most significant changes:**
 - Appendix H – Complaints and Grievances: Panels that hear grievances must include consumers. New appendix sets target of 20% of all panels. Committee members had questions as to how % was derived: Steve Remillard of OMHSAS explained it was the best estimate of the highest realistic number, based on past experience of actual consumer availability to participate.

- **Value-Based Purchasing: Stakeholder Roundtable Meetings**
 - First Meeting in January was with Insurers
 - Second Meeting held May 9, 2018, focused on Providers
 - DHS participants included DHS Executive Deputy Secretary Leesa Allen and OMAP Deputy Secretary Sally Kozak
 - Other Commonwealth Participants included Secretary of Health Dr. Rachel Levine, PA Insurance Commission
 - Provider participants included Pediatricians, Family Based Health Systems, Home Health reps, Medical Suppliers
 - Broad and diverse array of providers, facilities, hospitals and organizations represented, Generally positive feedback, providers were actively engaged in discussion, open to sharing issues of concern regarding VBP, including:
 - Data – would like to get more frequent/monthly and more current performance data
 - Pediatricians and selected Specialists would like greater representation and input, more emphasis on their practices
 - Receive/incorporate information from other payors/delivery systems
 - Concerns regarding complete and accurate attribution of patients and composition of panels/rosters
 - Patient Centered Medical Homes
 - Prior Authorization: integration with provider portal
 - HIE's, HIO's, DMR's – getting providers connected
 - Third Meeting (date TBD) will focus on Behavioral Health Providers
