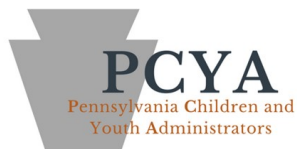

This two-day session is designed to introduce administrators to leadership and organizational effectiveness. On day one, the administrator is reintroduced to concepts and theories that they must fully understand to be an effective leader. The concepts/theories include: framework for child welfare practice; qualities of leadership and leadership strengths; and use of information and data in decision-making and strategic planning. On day two, administrators are introduced to organizational effectiveness concepts. Administrators will apply the concepts to their agency through an assessment process (using information from day one) and participate in the development of a change plan. The change plan will outline the action steps the leaders need to take in articulating their vision, mission, and values for the agency to staff and key stakeholders. In addition, the change plan will identify how they will engage staff and stakeholders in implementing a strategic framework and strategic initiatives that will support agency outcomes. The prerequisite for this course is 9000 Leading with Strengths. Participants are encouraged to register for both courses together.
