Pennsylvania Unemployment Office Issues Updated Fraud Warning and Response Guide



Over the past few months, the GKH Employment Law Practice Group has been contacted by many concerned employers who have received notices from the Unemployment Compensation Service Center that an employee who is still employed, an individual who has never been an employee, or even the business owner himself, has applied for unemployment compensation benefits. It is clear that these people have not

applied for unemployment compensation. Rather, this is an elaborate fraud attempt. This type of fraud is not limited to large employers - businesses of all sizes are being targeted.
