Behavioral Health HealthChoices

Behavioral health is part of an integrated human services model in Pennsylvania. Behavioral health care is for:

- Mental health conditions
- Substance use disorders
- Developmental disabilities

Behavioral HealthChoices is operated under direction of the counties


• This is a newer benefit for individuals in nursing homes and those who receive Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS).

The company that manages behavioral health needs will depend on the county in which you live

 This differs from the Physical and Community HealthChoices that allows individuals to choose a specific MCO

Many people who are covered by Medicaid also have other health insurance - Medicare is an example.

- Medicaid is the payor of last resort that means a person must use their primary first.
- Many people in the Community HealthChoices program are dual eligible for Medicare and Medicaid-This means that Medicare will cover much of the behavioral health benefits.

In Lieu/Supplement Services

BH-MCOs may provide additional services beyond those required as part of the State plan services


- These services are called "In-lieu of services" or "supplemental service".
- The services need to be medically necessary and costeffective alternatives.
- The services that are available may differ between regions.

• The BH-MCO's can help you figure out if there are any supplemental services that may benefit individuals you are working with.


Coordination & Collaboration

Customer Service



- Provides benefit and coverage information and eligibility verification
- Evaluates member's level of need; escalated to clinical staff if urgent or emergent
- Answers member and provider calls


Care Management



- Collects and reviews clinical information
- Ensures coordination and continuity of care
- Promotes full member and family participation in treatment plan development
- Assesses medical necessity
- Participates in interagency team meetings


Coordination & Collaboration

High Risk Care Management



- Works with high risk or at-risk members who require more intensive management due to a complex presentation.
- Utilizes longitudinal care management strategies
- Facilitates linkage to specialized services and monitors the service delivery

Physician & Psychological Services



- Renders medical necessity determinations
- Attends interagency meetings on complex cases
- Promotes recovery-oriented treatment
- Facilitates provider meetings
- Conducts provider training

Working Together

- Regular meetings between the BH MCO and CHC MCO
- Case reviews to address needs, barriers and complex cases
- Daily and Monthly exchange of member and inpatient data
- Share 7 & 30-day follow up report
- Share 30-day readmission report
- Track behavioral health utilization
- Multiple ways to contact us
 - We promote a 'no wrong door' approach to contacting us
 - Each BH-MCO has local care management staff
 - Numerous Physician Advisors and Psychologists to assist with case and service reviews

Coordination and Collaboration with CHC's



The CHC-MCOs and BH-MCOs are required to have a behavioral health coordinator who is a behavioral health professional and located in Pennsylvania.

- ✓ Coordinate participant care needs with BH providers.
- ✓ Work with the CHC-MCO's



All BH-MCO's and CHC MCO's have regularly scheduled meetings that include the BH-Coordinators from both sides.

✓ Coordination and collaboration on specific cases takes places in these meetings.

Coordination and Collaboration with CHC's



BH-MCO's and CHC MCO's regularly hold interagency team meeting to coordinate and collaborate on cases.

- ✓ Requests for an interagency team meeting can come from many sources e.g., Services coordinators, BH providers, MCO's, advocates, family and members etc.
- ✓ Providers and other stakeholders also participate in interagency team meeting.
- ✓ BH-MCO's and CHC's both utilize our medical staff to assist in challenging cases.
- ✓ CHC Participants or others can contact their BH-MCO or CHC MCO for assistance in pulling together an interagency team meeting.



BH-MCO's utilize care management teams that are local to the community and are familiar with local programs and resources.


BH-MCO & CHC MCO CONTACTS

Point of Entry:

The Preferred Point of Entry is through the CHC Service Coordinator. Contact the Participant's CHC Service Coordinator who can assist you in coordinating the Participant's behavioral health needs. The Service Coordinator or MCO Behavioral Health Coordinator will consult with the assigned BH-MCO on which behavioral health services are most appropriate for the Participant. The Service Coordinator or Behavioral Health Coordinator will assist in securing the behavioral health services on behalf of the Participant and ensure delivery of the services. If you are unaware of the Participant's CHC Service Coordinator, you can use the CHC Contact list below to inquire.


