SNAP Emergency Allotment Reductions



- <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)</u>
- President Biden signed the 2023 Consolidated Appropriations Act late last year. This new law ends SNAP Emergency Allotments in February of 2023 after almost three years of issuance. The Emergency Allotments boosted all SNAP households benefit levels by at least \$95 and older adult households had some of the largest increases and will subsequently have some of the greatest decreases as a result of the policy ending.
- Individuals receiving Social Security received an 8.7% COLA, which now renders approximately 5,000 – 20,000 ineligible for SNAP. Individuals will be disenrolled in February.
- Many of those impacted and losing their SNAP benefits are older adults.

Appendix K Waiver Amend.

- Since March 6, 2020, the Office of Long-Term Living (OLTL) has been operating under the Appendix K, Emergency Preparedness and Response amendment approved by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). Appendix K allowed temporary changes to the Community HealthChoices and OBRA 1915(c) waivers in response to the COVID-19 global pandemic. These flexibilities were extended to the Act 150 Program.
- OLTL is planning to end these flexibilities on April 30th.
