

Infection Control Procedures and Mitigating the Spread

ODP Announcement 23-046

AUDIENCE:

All stakeholders

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this announcement is to:

- Draw attention to the revised guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA DOH) describing how to determine if a facility should be considered a healthcare or a nonhealthcare congregate setting; and
- Provide updated guidance to providers of the Office of Developmental Programs' (ODP) home and community-based services (HCBS) and Private Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with an Intellectual Disability (ICF/IDs) for development of policies related to infection control procedures

DISCUSSION:

This announcement, and the guidance contained within is intended to supplement—not replace—any federal, state, or local public health and safety laws, rules, and regulations with which providers must comply.

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Portions of the guidance provided by this announcement are provided in two, separate sections for providers of HCBS and ICF/ID services.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS)

The CDC updated guidance describing how to determine if a facility should be considered a healthcare or a non-healthcare congregative setting. While most Community Homes for Individuals with an Intellectual Disability or Autism licensed under Chapter 6400 will typically follow community prevention strategies as per CDC guidance, for settings in which individuals receive frequent and active healthcare interventions it may be more appropriate to follow guidance for healthcare settings.

Providers should establish policies and procedures accounting for population served, settings in which people are served, activities in which people engage and community respiratory virus transmission rates. This may necessitate coordination among providers

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for policy development to effectively support individuals receiving services from multiple providers, across multiple settings or locations.



In these instances, PA DOH guidance should be followed as the lead agency of the COVID-19 and other infectious diseases response for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

ODP expects providers to develop a layered protection strategy for infectious diseases, to include COVID-19. A layered protection strategy can also be referred to as the <u>Swiss</u> <u>Cheese Model of risk reduction</u>. The University of Iowa has also provided a <u>video</u> on the same concept, provided here to increase accessibility.

Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with an Intellectual Disability (ICF/IDs)

The PA DOH directs ICFs to follow guidance for healthcare facilities and is outlined in DOH HAN 694. Additionally, QSO-21- 14-ICF/IID & PRTF Revised 06.03.2021 (cms.gov) remains the most current from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) at this time and a link to this resource is included in the list below.

If an individual receives services from multiple providers, those providers should communicate information related to potential COVID-19 and other infectious diseases exposure and coordinate to take appropriate action for the health and safety of individuals and staff.
