# What to Expect When You Receive Services from PA Office of Developmental Programs (ODP)



When receiving ODP funded supports and services, various monitoring functions - activities, surveys,

interviews and visits-must occur. By assisting with these, you help to ensure that ODP is providing quality supports and services.

When eligible, you register for Intellectual Disability/Autism (ID/A) services through **vour County Administrative** Entity and you get to

select a Supports Coordination

Organization (SCO).

From the SCO you will be assigned a Supports Coordinator (SC) – Someone with whom you can discuss your life and goals.

Your SC will seek your input and assist you in developing a comprehensive **Individual Support** Plan (ISP) that should meet your needs and be updated at least



## **Supports Coordination 3 Basic Functions**

1. LOCATING

SC function of identifying needed service(s) and providers

2. COORDINATING **Development and on-going** management of the ISP

3. MONITORING Assessing the individual's health, safety, and well-being

#### **Supports Coordinator's Duties**

- 1. Facilitate meetings to ensure that the ISP is working for you and desired outcomes occur
- 2. Discuss your needs and update your ISP as your needs change
- 3. Explain waiver services and budget caps
- 4. Conduct face-to-face and/or virtual monitoring determined by your waiver enrollment
- 5. Assist you with identifying services that are provided through Waivers or Base Funding
- 6. Informing/educating families on activities to participate in, such as IM4Q

#### **Types of Waivers**

- 1. Consolidated Waiver (CW)
- 2. Community Living Waiver (CLW)

- 4. Adult Autism Waiver (AAW)
