PITTSBURGH MERCY INTELLECTUAL & DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES SERVICES PARTICIPANTS HONOR VETERANS, DECORATE GRAVES WITH U.S. FLAGS FOR MEMORIAL DAY

WHAT: In preparation for Memorial Day, a U.S. tradition practiced since the Civil War

once known as Decoration Day and a federal holiday since 1971, volunteers from Pittsburgh Mercy Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities Services will decorate the graves of military veterans of all wars with U.S. flags to honor them for their service and sacrifice to our nation. The group has volunteered for this important community service activity for nearly a decade. Pittsburgh Mercy Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities Services serves more than 700 adults who have intellectual disabilities and their families/caregivers annually, making it one of the

largest IDD service providers in Southwestern Pennsylvania.

WHEN: Wednesday, May 22, 2024, from 10:45 a.m. to 12 p.m.

WHERE: Allegheny Cemetery Soldiers' Memorial Plot (Section 34)

Established in 1844, <u>Allegheny Cemetery</u> is the final resting place of more than 14,000 U.S. veterans, including eight Civil War generals. It hosts one of the largest and longest-running Memorial Day observances in the nation. The Soldier's Memorial Plot honors veterans of all wars and overlooks the Civil War National Cemetery.
