

RCPA's Capitol Day FAQ

Q: Who should attend RCPA's Capitol Day?

A: State Government impacts every RCPA member's business, so RCPA encourages all members to participate.

Q: Will RCPA assist members in putting together legislative meetings?

A: RCPA will provide members with ideas on how to structure their legislative visits for Capitol Day. This day is primarily an RCPA member advocacy initiative and is designed to advance RCPA member's relationships with legislators and government officials. As a result, RCPA is unable to coordinate a member's legislative meeting schedule during Capitol Day. Q: Should members plan meetings with legislators and staff?

A: RCPA encourages members to schedule meetings with as many legislators and government officials as possible during Capitol Day. Depending on how long a member can stay in Harrisburg, invitees might include members from the governor's staff, department heads, and/or legislator's staff.

Q: Can members set up luncheons, forums, meetings, etc. with multiple officials instead of meeting with only one?

A: Yes. RCPA would like to see Capitol Day reach as many legislators and government officials as possible. Members are free to determine how to effectively implement their own Capitol Day experience.
