Today, we **employ over 3,500 people and offer more than 24,000 people across the mid-Atlantic** region a vast array of services — educational, employment, vocational, residential, habilitative and behavioral health — through a network of **national and international affiliates**. Our consolidated revenue is over \$275 million in fiscal year 2024.

Our Behavioral Health Division does business in Pennsylvania, Delaware and New Jersey providing an array of community based Behavioral Health and Substance Abuse Disorders services. Holcomb Behavioral Health Systems provides a comprehensive range of services and supports for people with mental health, substance abuse, intellectual and developmental disabilities, and co-occurring disorders.	Chimes offers an array of supported living options and staffing alternatives to enable individuals with IDD to live in homes and communities of their choice. Traditional residential options include agency operated single-family homes and apartments for people who choose to live with roommates and may require 24-hour support.	Chimes offers day support and volunteer options throughout the mid-Atlantic. Our day supports are provided in both facility and in the community and emphasize enrichment activities, skill acquisition and full community participation.	Vocational program participants have access to work and career-based assessments, training, and job placement opportunities geared to individual aptitudes and interests. Individuals engage in paid contract work within the facility or supported employment in the community with on-going staff support.	Chimes provides training and employment for people with severe disabilities through the Ability One Maryland Works programs. Through multiple federal and state contracts, we employ over 1,400 people at sites in Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, North Carolina and the District of Columbia.
