to use the tool: Prepared People Save Lives Toolkit

The HVA will:

• Identify and rank different hazards (natural disasters, technology failures,

human-caused dangers);

• Look at how vulnerable the program is and figure out what needs

improvement through planning factors;

Allow for continuous process improvement annually, making services resilient,

and more prepared for emergencies.

This toolkit reinforces our shared commitment to year-round readiness—not just during

National Preparedness Month in September. Leaders in residential habilitation and day

services should focus on disaster preparedness every day, because it keeps people safe,

avoids big financial problems, and builds trust. The HVA is an important step in any

organization's emergency operations planning and it opens a dialog with partners at all

levels.

Let's continue building a more resilient future for those we serve—their families, our

providers, our staff and our communities—by staying proactive, informed, and

connected.
